





To Janské Lázně, to Černá hora by cable car, then on foot or sleds/bobsleds to Pec

You can take a bus to Janské Lázně, getting off at the Janské Lázně, Zátiší stop is a 5-minute walk from there to the cable car. Alternatively, you can use the free ski bus on line No.1, which will take you directly to the bottom station of the cable car. Take the cable car to Černá Hora. From there, walk along the yellow trail and then the red one. Most of the route can be traversed on sleds or bobsleds around the Černohorské rašeliniště (peat bog) with a lookout tower. On the way to Pec, you'll find Kolínská bouda with refreshments open daily, Pražská bouda, and Žižkova bouda (also with refreshments).



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Through the valley of the Zelený Potok to Jelení louky and back via the "Chaloupky" and Velká pláň

From the hotel, head towards the slopes. At the bridge before parking lot P4 Zelený potok, turn right behind the stream alongside the Doulík Apartments towards the back. It's a pleasant walk through the Zelené Údolí along the Zelený



Potok with little frequency of tourists. It's a beautiful valley with many pools along the way where you can cool down. The path ends at a huge meadow where a restaurant Chalupa Jelení louky is located. Along the way, you'll notice a place that serves as a water source for Pec pod Sněžkou. It's a historical water intake which was used more than 100 years ago. You can return back the same way or take the asphalt road which leads through an area called Chaloupky and acrosses Velká pláň back to Pec.

To the chapel in Obří Důl and back

© 2 hours ─ 7 km

This is a gentle route along the Obří Důl valley alongside the Úpa River. The route begins near the bobsleigh track and the rope park. From the busy asphalt road, you can slightly turn left and walk to the bottom cable car station along a se-



ries of gaming elements. There's a large children's playground at the bottom cable car station to Sněžka as well. Continue along the river, past the Bouda in Obří Důl, around the Bouda pod Sněžkou, where are llamas along the way to the Chapel.







To the highest lookout tower in the Krkonoše Mountains, Hnědý Vrch, and then on sleds or bobsleds round the Lyžařská bouda back to Pec

(3:50 hours → 10.8 km

From the hotel, head towards the slopes, past the parking lot, along the stream. From the slope Javor, follow the marked yellow hiking trail. You can take the cable car to Hnědý vrch. The highest lookout tower in the Krkonoše Mountains is located at an altitude of 1,207 meters above sea level. Unfortunately, it's closed this winter, but even from its base, there's a beautiful view of the main ridge of the Giant Mountains, especially Sněžka Mountain, Luční Mountain and Studniční Mountain. The path from the tower towards the



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Lyžařská bouda is lined with an educational trail by KRNAP with several stops. You can refresh yourself both at the Lyžařská Bouda and the Lesní Bouda. Then you descend on a forest road back to Pec on sleds or bobsleds. Watch out for skiers and snow machines that you might encounter.
